


High School Planning & Transcript Preparation II

Colleges are now interested in recruiting homeschoolers, but they also want to be assured that they are well-rounded students. To convince college admissions boards that your student is a multi-faceted individual, keeping track of the non-academic activities is vital.

As the year progresses, simply jot down notes about the things your child does outside of school. Examples might be volunteer work, playing on organized sports teams, administering a website, running the sound system at church, and so on. For as many events as possible, document the person in charge of the activity. This way, when the time comes to actually write up the transcript, you will be prepared. You will also be ahead of the game when the admissions board requests letters of recommendation from people outside your family
